A Message from the President of Indian Valley Foundation

The Indian Valley Foundation's Mission is to provide a shared vision of creating an organization whose main purpose is to enhance academic excellence within the Indian Valley School District. Countless volunteer hours are being contributed each year by our Directors to raise the necessary funds needed to achieve our goals. In addition to our Directors, we want to say thanks to our volunteer Building Representatives Wanda Krocker, Kayla Burcher, Patty Couts, Kristen Maurer, and Jenny Robinson. Their participation on the Foundation has made a tremendous impact on our communication with each building, ensuring our information reaches all students and staff.

Our Foundation mourns the loss of Mrs. Martha Roudebush who passed away earlier this year. Martha was instrumental in helping organize the Foundation and served as President for twelve years before stepping down due to health reasons. Her absence is not only an enormous loss to her family and friends but also to our Foundation and the Indian Valley

community.

In December 2022, our Foundation was blessed to receive approximately \$691,000 from the estate of a former teacher who taught in our district. We immediately invested these funds, which provided an additional \$31,000 of income and allowed us to increase our scholarships this past spring. It is our goal to maintain the principal of these funds as well as previous endowments to provide enough investment income to provide a steady flow of revenue for our scholarship fund for years to come.

This newsletter features our 2023 scholarship award recipients. During our Spring Scholarship Awards, we awarded 53 scholarships totaling \$80,000. This year the Foundation focused our efforts on our senior students who attend the Buckeye Career Center to apply for our scholarships. IV Counselor Jenny Robinson and Superintendent Bob Alsept arranged a meeting with our senior students and Foundation Directors Pat Kohl, Mark Natoli, and myself. Our purpose was to help them with their applications and explain what expenses our scholarships provide. This turned out to be a very rewarding experience as we were able to present 15 scholarships to our Buckeye students, compared to only a few Buckeye students during the past years in which we have awarded scholarships. For the 2023-2024 school year, there are 153 IV students attending Buckeye and we are pleased to announce we will be awarding a \$2,000 grant each year to the Buckeye Career Center to be used to benefit the students of IV who are attending Buckeye.

Our Gala event held this past April continues to be one of the most successful fundraising efforts of our Foundation. Once again, the community continues to support us in raising the necessary funds we provide to the students and staff at Indian Valley. Our last event was attended by close to 260 people and raised a little over \$49,000, yet another record amount for this event. Our next Gala event will be held April 6, 2024, at the Harvest Barn in Sugarcreek.

2023 Gala and Sponsors

The Indian Valley Foundation's 2023 Spring Gala was our fifth annual fundraising event and was another huge success. This event was held on April 15, 2023, at the Harvest Barn in Sugarcreek with 260 people in attendance. The total money raised was \$68,686 and after deducting \$19,459 in expenses, the net income was \$49,227. We had 72 sponsors that donated \$27,875, 35 live auction items that brought in \$21,805, and 80 silent auction items that brought in \$6,495. The wine pull, gift card pull, meat & gun raffle, bar income, tickets sales and donations accounted for the remaining \$12,511 that was raised.

The Spring Gala has become our signature fundraising event, as well as a very popular social event for the Indian Valley Community. Since our first Gala in 2018 we have raised over \$195,000 from these five fundraisers. The funds from the Gala has allowed the Indian Valley Foundation to significantly increase the support we provide to the Indian Valley Schools in the way of classroom grants, building grants, and post-secondary scholarships.

Our 2024 Spring Gala is planned for April 6, 2024, at the Harvest Barn in Sugarcreek, OH. We hope to see you all there!

Port Washington Elementary - Gala Guests of Honor Recipient of the 2022 National Blue Ribbon School

The United States Department of Education recognized Port Washington Elementary School as a 2022 Blue Ribbon School. The school which serves nearly 400 students from kindergarten through grade five won in the category of Exemplary High Performance Schools. Principal Troy Page, Patty Couts, Megan Heath, Brandy Grant, Lindsay Trushell, Kristen Rine, Courtney Hursey, Leann Ong and Superintendent Dr. Ira Wentworth represented Port Washington Elementary at this award ceremony.

Port Washington Elementary School was one of only thirteen schools in Ohio to win this award in 2022. Schools can receive this award as often as every five years. Port Washington previously won this award in 2003 and was honored as a two-time winner at the ceremony. The school received a plaque and a flag to display. "It all goes back to our students, our staff, and our families." Troy Page said. "They are the ones that put in all the work on a daily basis, and it's just nice to be recognized for doing what they do. That is what makes our school special."

2023 Classroom & Building Grants

Indian Valley Foundation not only awards scholarships to our graduating seniors, we award our outstanding teachers, principals and students who supported and paved the way for those seniors to reach graduation. Each year we offer Classroom Grants of up to \$500 to each teacher who applies and Building Grants of \$2000 to each building.

Our Classroom & Building Grant guidelines make every effort to assure that all grants benefit a minimum of 75% of our students equally. For the 2023-2024 school year, we are excited that we once again had a record number of applications from our teachers! Thanks to the Foundation's support from the community and our increased Gala profits each year, we were able to award grants to 34 teachers totaling \$14,288.00 and \$8,000 to our four principals. Indian Valley Foundation is dedicated to raising funds for our schools. We work hand in hand with Indian Valley School District and Buckeye Career Center.

Pictured below are a few of the 153 Indian Valley students attending Buckeye Career Center this year. The Indian Valley Foundation felt it only fair we provide some financial support to them, the same as we are providing to our students attending within our district. It is our policy: any funds we provide must directly benefit our IV students. At Buckeye, this has presented a unique situation because our students participate in many different career programs. The high cost of fees and requirements associated with their career choices place a financial burden on both students and families. The Indian Valley Foundation is pleased to announce our Board of Directors has voted to provide a \$2,000 grant to the Buckeye Career Center to be used exclusively to benefit only our students attending Buckeye.

A Message from Indian Valley Superintendent Dr. Ira Wentworth

Blessed. As Principal of Midvale Elementary in 2009, I remember being asked if a start-up group could use our library one evening to discuss a potential foundation. That was when I first met Minnie Garabrandt. Minnie had a vision of what a foundation could do for Indian Valley students. She had consulted others who had pioneered similar efforts for public school districts and had gathered information on how to gain 501(c)(3) status as a charitable organization. She had a vision and was working tirelessly to help others see it too.

Thinking back to 2009 and seeing where the Indian Valley Foundation is in 2023, two things immediately stand out. Firstly, the financial support provided to students since 2009 in terms of scholarships is surreal. Not only has the IVF given a tremendous amount of money to graduating seniors each year, the amount they have given continues to increase annually. The IVF has not plateaued; it is still a young foundation that continues to grow in the scope of its impact. Additionally, the number of classroom grants and size of their annual building grants is impacting students at all grade levels in all our school buildings. Minnie's vision was spot on; the IVF is doing great things for Indian Valley students.

Secondly, Minnie's work to help others catch the vision of a foundation's influence has been most successful. Actually, others being able to see what she saw from the beginning is the cornerstone of the IVF's success. Since 2009, there have been many who have been involved in leading the IVF to its current prominence. Countless others have served on the IVF Board, worked on committees, and helped out with fundraising efforts. They do this because they see what Minnie saw in 2009 --- a group of people working together for the direct benefit of Indian Valley students.



Scholarship Information

Scholarship Applications: Graduating seniors must submit their completed applications in early April of their senior year. Currently we are offering one-year scholarships worth \$1000 to \$3000.

Scholarship Selection Criteria: IVHS Scholarships are evaluated on class rank, college entry scores, leadership, community service and an evaluation of written essays. Buckeye Career Center Scholarships are evaluated on leadership, completed certifications/work history, community service and written essays. Scholarships are then awarded based on a subjective evaluation of candidates by Indian Valley Foundation Board of Directors. In order to receive funding that will be paid directly to the institution, all scholarship recipients must provide the Foundation with required documentation that is outlined in the application.

The method of funding a scholarship: One-time scholarships are established yearly with a minimum donation of \$500. Endowed scholarships, where only the earnings are used to pay out a scholarship each year, may be established starting at \$10,000.
