UPDATE OF HAPPENINGS FOR Indian Valley Foundation

The Indian Valley Foundation has become well established. To date, **58** classroom grants, up to **\$250** each, and **64** scholarships, **\$500** each have been awarded. Fall of 2011, 2012, and 2013 grants of **\$1500** were awarded to each of the four district buildings, totaling **\$18,000**. The IVF continues to welcome new teachers to the Indian Valley Schools with a cash gift. A total of **\$103,300** has been raised through 2013.

Established in November 2009, the Indian Valley Foundation is an independent, non-profit, 501(c)3 charitable organization. Governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, all Indian Valley Foundation programs and activities are planned and implemented by volunteers from the community, school district and alumni. New volunteers are welcome!
