At the 6th Annual Scholarship Recognition Banquet in April of 2017, twenty-five scholarships totaling \$14,600 were awarded to very deserving graduating Indian Valley seniors.

The last graduating class of Gnadenhutten High School (1967) exceeded their goal of \$1,967 by giving a \$1,000 scholarship this year and they will give a \$1,000 scholarship next year (2018).

The Indian Valley South Class of 1977 gave a \$600 scholarship. Scholarships were also given by the GHS Alumni in memory of Jack McKeown and Barbara Williams Daniels. Friends and family members of Barb gave a \$1,000 scholarship in her memory.

2016 Treasurer's Brief Report

Indian Valley Foundation continues to give added support to the teachers and students of Indian Valley

- A total of \$196,241 has been raised through 2016 and the Foundation has expended \$188,603.
- 92 classroom grants, up to \$250 each, totaling \$20,234
- 99 scholarships totaling \$55,300 have been awarded.
- Each Fall since 2011, grants of \$1,500 have been awarded to each district building, totaling \$36,000.

Established in November 2009, the Indian Valley Foundation is an independent, non-profit, 501(c)3 charitable organization. Governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, all Indian Valley Foundation programs and activities are planned and implemented by volunteers from the community, school district and alumni. *New volunteers are welcome!*


